Arrangements are in place for international tourists to get to their home countries. Sri Lankan Airlines will allow charter flights to fly out remaining tourists on request.

Curfew remains in place indefinitely in the districts of Colombo, Kalutara, Gampaha, Puttalam, Kandy, Jaffna. Curfew in other districts to be lifted April 1st (Wednesday) 6.00am.

Sri Lanka's ban on aircraft arrivals to the Bandaranaike International Airport extended to the 07th of April: Civil Aviation Authority.

Update of 26th March 2020

Sri Lanka

1. Curfew remains in place indefinitely in the districts of Colombo, Kalutara and Gampaha.
2. Curfew in other districts to be lifted March 26 (Friday) at 6.00am and re-imposed at 12 noon.
3. Curfew in Puttlam and Northern Province Districts to be lifted on March 27 (Saturday) 6.00am and re-imposed at 12 noon.
4. Traveling between districts is totally banned across the island.
5. Transportation of tourists is banned unless going to the airport with curfew pass.
6. The public has been requested to call 119/ +94 112444480/ +94 112444481 - if they have come in contact with someone with Covid-19 or if they display symptoms of the virus.

Please note the following developments in relation to travel to Sri Lanka and the Maldives.

Sri Lanka

The Government of Sri Lanka has suspended all passenger arrivals to the Bandaranaike International Airport for two weeks with effect from midnight on 18th March 2020.

It has been declared a three-day public holiday on the 17, 18, 19 March, excluding health, food supply, transport, essential services, banks, government agent and district secretariat offices.

All tourist sites are closed; including the game parks. Movie theatres are not screening movies and public events have been banned until further notice. Tourism-related services such as guide services are also suspended until further notice.

The Government of Maldives has declared a Public Health Emergency for 30 days from 12 March 2020 - 10 April 2020. Travel between resorts and Inhabited Islands is restricted.
